CHALLENGES

- legislation (EU transposition, implementation gap)
- ownership – liability, restitution, privatization,
- financing – no “super fund”, weak or non-existent eco funds, therefore dependence on donor funds
- institutional and organizational - systems for identification and prioritization, inventories, costs

Country/territory specifics

-BiH – complex administration structure; MNE – overlap of Ministry jurisdictions (environment and economy); SRB – restitution, env. Monitoring system; UNATSCR 1244 – env information system and public private partnership



NEXT STEPS

- Making inventories, prioritizing and costing interventions
- Development of mechanisms for exchange of experience and knowledge (build knowledge centre of excellence, data base of practitioners)
- Developing joint regional programmes (case studies)
- Capacity development and public awareness raising activities (regional policy level exchange)
- Development of joint regional initiatives (build partnerships at different levels)
- Identification of financing mechanisms and strategies for “Brownfields” remediation and management (Eco Funds, Green Taxes, Public Private Partnership, Redevelopment, Cost Recovery mechanisms)
